
Funeral




Bible by The Beach 4 - 7 May 2018

Men's Breakfast





JPK Sussex Project

Jill Parker MBE, who recently visited CAMEO, has sent this email encouraging everyone to take part in project.



Dear Friends and Supporters,

The JPK Sussex Project applied to Tesco Bags of Help for a Grant towards much needed equipment for the Community Training Centre, which includes the Palm Court Tea Room and Commercial Training Kitchen. Although much of the major equipment has been funded and purchased we still require many other items to fully equip these areas for use by the Students who will be attending training courses and also for the future training Staff and Volunteers.

I am delighted to announce that the JPK has been successful in its application and is one of the three local charities to have been chosen.

The Next Stage of the process is the public vote where Tesco's Customers vote to decide how much money our project will be given, which will be either £1,000, £2,000 or £4,000.

Voting has commenced in the local Tesco Stores by way of tokens being handed out when you shop and placed in one of the three collection receptacles at the exit to the tills. Voting closes at the end of February.
