building regulations have spiralled out of reach of their already tight budget.

The team have a deadline date for vacating their current premises. They have seen another building which also requires substantial refurbishment so they would value everyone standing together in prayer.

Best Start is a 'More Than' project run by Eastbourne Foodbank. We aim to provide the following to families facing difficult circumstances:

- Moses baskets with 'basics' including clothing, nappies and a new mattress for expectant Mothers and Families
- New Mum packs including sanitary items and hospital bag essentials
- Baby, toddler and children's clothing, shoes, bedding and equipment

Central to providing these 'Best Start' items we aim to:

- · Raise money to purchase appropriate new items
- Raise awareness of the project with potential referrers
- Increase donations of 'Best Start' items to Eastbourne Foodbank

We have no set criteria for who can and cannot receive a baby package but all requests must come via referral from a health care professional, church or agency. We have created a process that is completely non judgemental. Our aim is to provide hope and love in an otherwise difficult situation. We believe every child has the right to start life with their basic needs met.

A Word From Our Wardens

Following the Awayday last week the PCC members felt it important to update you, the congregation, with our deliberations. Firstly we would like to thank you for your prayers and the feedback we have received from many of you in seeking to move forward in all areas of our church life.

The day itself began with personal testimony of a new church member coming to faith in Jesus.

This was followed by exciting news of the growth in a number of areas of our children's work including the initiative to reintroduce scouting to St John's.

An update was then provided on the reordering of church fabric. On this item CPL architects are looking shortly to provide the final drawings and support documentation for faculty submission and approval.

After a break we engaged in a number of workshops that allowed us to look in detail at the feedback from our listening sessions over the past few weeks. As you would have wanted this was a lengthy and thought provoking time. As there was not enough time in the day itself to complete this task, it was decided representatives from the various workshop groups would bring the conclusions together for the PCC to consider at its meeting on 11 October.

This may all seem a lengthy process, and it is, but it is indicative of the lengths that PCC feel we need to go to ensure we have the right result. A key element that came through on the day was that of valuing one another in Christ and valuing the rich diversity of worship that the Anglican community represents here at St John's. Our prayer as a PCC is that you will feel valued as an individual child of God here at St John's, and be able to value all those around who seek to proclaim the love of our Father God to the community here in Meads.

Lunch Club

Our monthly Lunch Club at the Parish Hall is going from strength to strength and we now have a large number of regular visitors who really enjoy coming to have a nice lunch in a friendly atmosphere, meet up with friends and have a chat. If you'd like to come along to our next lunch it will be held on Monday 7 November from 12 noon, lunch costs £3.
