Building for the Future - Re-ordering update

On Wednesday we received confirmation that our application for funding support from the Heritage Lottery Fund had been successful. This grant is towards the cost of repairing the church tower, as well as putting on our Remembrance Festival in November and then creating a more permanent heritage display in the tower once it has been repaired, centred on our War Memorial (it would not have been possible to apply for the tower repairs alone).

Together with existing Church reserves, pledges from the Church Family and additional grants we are now much closer to reaching our appeal target to enable us to complete not only the internal reordering but also the tower and west window repairs. To be in this position is nothing short of miraculous and we give God all the praise and honour for His gracious provision.

This news also coincided with the receipt of four tenders from building contractors recommended by our Church architects from which a preferred contractor has been identified. Subject to securing an alternative venue for our worship whilst building work takes place we could be looking at starting as early as next month.

We still need to raise an additional £50,000 to do everything in our plans. We are however going to press on with the first phase of reordering* and this will be followed by the external repairs after the Remembrance Festival has taken place. We therefore have two requests:

Firstly, that all those who have already generously pledged their support, to let Frank, our Treasurer, have any outstanding pledges.

Secondly, if you haven't already had an opportunity to support the Building for the Future appeal now is the time to do so, to help us to bridge this final gap in funding.

Together, our support will make all the difference in enabling St John's to take this significant next step in both preserving and adapting our worship space for future generations.

Festival of Remembrance

St John's, Meads is planning a Festival of Remembrance during the week of 4th November to the 11th. This will culminate in a 24hr vigil in the church tower 09.00hrs Saturday 10th to 09.00hrs Sunday 11th November, where the parish war memorial is displayed. We will split up the vigil in to 24 x 1hr watches. This is to allow for anyone at any time, to visit the war memorial over that period. There are 69 names recorded of those who died and it is our intention to light a candle in memory of all of them.

At 03.05hrs a whistle will blow and all candles will be blown out to signify when troops from South Downs regiments were involved in some of their most significant losses at the battle of Boars Head on the 30th of June 1916.

At 07.09hrs Reveille and the Last Post will be sounded and a lone piper will be playing Flowers of the Forest. With a short field service of Remembrance outside the tower, weather permitting.

How can you help?

I am looking for teams of three, to be keepers of the watch during the vigil from 09.00hrs Saturday I0th November to 09.00hrs on Sunday I1th November. You would be assigned a Ihour slot. I would emphasise that although the church houses the parish memorial, we act as custodians on their behalf, there will be those who were of faith and no faith, and we want to provide all with an opportunity to remember in their own way.

Your role would be to enable this.

We intend to light a candle in memory of those recorded on the memorial, which died in the service for their country, and would extend this to anyone who has died in the services on active duty, and is known to a member of the community of Eastbourne up to today, as family, friend or mate. If you could make this offer known to friends and colleagues we would count it our humble privilege to acknowledge those who have made the ultimate sacrifice for us all and remember them by lighting a candle.
