## Building for the Future - Re-ordering update

As you will know we have been actively seeking out an alternative venue for our worship during the reordering. The parish hall was a popular choice however we found we were running into a number of difficulties over the limited space it offers for larger services and the parking issues highlighted by the local council.

Following a generous donation and a supportive response from the council we have now agreed to go ahead with the erection of a marquee on the north side of the church. This will provide both ample space for our worship, easy access to the children's groups and the big advantage of keeping us on sight so that we don't miss visitors.

Our last Sunday in the building will be **Sunday 2nd September** and we anticipate returning to the church with time to spare ahead of the Festival of Remembrance.

Whilst the size of our 9.30am congregation makes the use of the marquee essential it is anticipated that both the 8am and 11.15am services can be temporarily held in the Jubilee Hall.

Logistically the setting up for worship will require some effort and we will be looking for teams of volunteers to help with set up and set down during this time. Please speak to either Vanessa or Tony if you are able to help with this.

Lastly a reminder that we are still working towards closing the deficit in the total cost of the work and would ask:

All those who have already generously pledged their support, to let Frank, our Treasurer, have any outstanding pledges.

If you haven't already had an opportunity to support the Building for the Future appeal now is the time to do so, to help us to bridge this final gap in funding.

Together, our support will make all the difference in enabling St John's to take this significant next step in both preserving and adapting our worship space for future generations.


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## Remembrance Festival and Heritage Project

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### New Look for Sunday 9.30 Service from September

From Sunday 9th September we will be trialling a new format for the 9.30am Service. Families without children go directly into church. Those families with children will be directed to the Jubilee Hall via the side path where they will register their children, drop them off in the hall and then proceed into church or remain with toddlers.

The children will have their own programme which will start at 9.30am then on communion Sundays we will join the congregation during the pre-communion song and on non-communion Sundays we will join the congregation for a time of family sharing and singing at the end of the service.

The programme for the children will look slightly different too: we will begin with a prayer and welcome session then split into two age groups – Rising Star 0-5 years (Jubilees Hall) and The Big God Space 5-11 years (Pauling Room) for play and/or reflection before joining our families in church. The teens will be encouraged to lead and serve in different capacities during the service.
