Building for the Future - Re-ordering update

This week has brought some significant and wonderful news which we are thrilled to pass on.

On Wednesday we received confirmation that our application for funding support from the Heritage Lottery Fund had been successful. This grant is towards the cost of repairing the church tower, as well as putting on our Remembrance Festival in November and then creating a more permanent heritage display in the tower once it has been repaired, centred on our War Memorial (it would not have been possible to apply for the tower repairs alone).

Together with existing Church reserves, pledges from the Church Family and additional grants we are now much closer to reaching our appeal target to enable us to complete not only the internal reordering but also the tower and west window repairs. To be in this position is nothing short of miraculous and we give God all the praise and honour for His gracious provision.

This news also coincided with the receipt of four tenders from building contractors recommended by our Church architects from which a preferred contractor has been identified. Subject to securing an alternative venue for our worship whilst building work takes place we could be looking at starting as early as next month.

We still need to raise an additional £50,000 to do everything in our plans. We are however going to press on with the first phase of reordering* and this will be followed by the external repairs after the Remembrance Festival has taken place. We therefore have two requests:

Firstly, that all those who have already generously pledged their support, to let Frank, our Treasurer, have any outstanding pledges.

Secondly, if you haven't already had an opportunity to support the Building for the Future appeal now is the time to do so, to help us to bridge this final gap in funding.

Together, our support will make all the difference in enabling St John's to take this significant next step in both preserving and adapting our worship space for future generations.

St John's Festival of Remembrance

This year the Commonwealth will mark the centenary of the end of World War I. On 11 November 2018, we will observe Remembrance Sunday, reflecting on the lives that were changed irrevocably, and those that were lost. Some of those were local men, whose lives are remembered on the War Memorial in St John's Church Tower.

During this year, as part of our 60th anniversary 'Building for the Future' appeal, we plan to repair the church tower so it can be opened to the public.

We will mark the anniversary of the end of World War I with a Remembrance Festival on Saturday and Sunday 10 and 11 November. As well as marking this significant 100th anniversary, we will also give thanks for the sacrifice made by many men and women in more recent conflicts.

Initial plans include a prayer vigil in the tower from 10.00am on Saturday 10 November through the night to 10.00am on 11 November and the start of our Remembrance Sunday service.

Also an opportunity for members of the parish to share items that they may have of that period in a display in church. Members of the parish will also be encouraged to engage in researching the stories of those named on the memorial to create life stories of those recorded.


